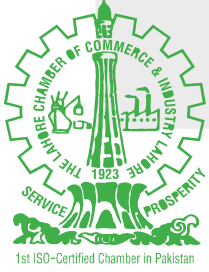

Enhancing agri productivity essential; Rana Tanveer Hussain

Agricultural productivity is very low and must be improved. Both the government and private sector need to invest in research, and the government will fund anyone conducting research in agriculture. Better seeds are the key to progress. These views were expressed by Federal Minister for National Food Security & Research Rana Tanveer Hussain during his address at the Lahore Chamber of Commerce & Industry. On the occasion, LCCI President Faheem-ur-Rehman Saigol, Vice President Khurram Lodhi, SAARC Chamber Vice President Mian Anjum Nisar, former LCCI President Muhammad Ali Mian, and Executive Committee members were also present.

LCCI President Faheem-ur-Rehman Saigol said that Food Security is one of the most important ministries of the country and Pakistan is among the na-

tions facing serious food security challenges. He said that the per-acre crop yield

in Pakistan is significantly lower compared to other countries in the region. Wheat, rice, and

cotton bale production has declined compared to the previous year.

He said that despite being an agricultural country, Pakistan is importing food items and fertilizers, which is highly alarming. Our seed quality cannot compete globally and requires immediate reforms. Special focus should be given to food processing and the halal food industry to

improve the economy through value-addition. Faheem-ur-Rehman Saigol said that the country's population is increasing while food production is declining. Nearly 50% of the popu-



lation has fallen below the poverty line, leading to rising crime rates. He highlighted that cotton

production has fallen from over 10 million bales to around 7 million, and almost 30% of produce is wasted during harvest, representing a major system failure.

He urged the government to take immediate steps for compensating farmer losses, increasing the wheat support price, and developing the agricultural sector on modern lines.

Federal Minister Rana Tanveer Hussain further said that he has always worked for the improvement of all sectors and had previously held the portfolio of Industries & Production by choice. Food security has now become a global issue and is being considered extremely important worldwide. He said work is underway to bring the policy rate into single

• decisions which negatively impact growth. He informed that the National Seed Regulatory Authority has been established, counterfeit seeds are being strictly controlled, and a Track & Trace system is being introduced for certified seeds. Banks have been instructed to enhance financing for agriculture, along with better SME financing. Rana Tanveer Hussain said that fertilizer shortages have been prevented and prices have also been controlled. He stated that agri-based industries have massive global demand, with huge opportunities for halal meat and rice exports. Pakistan is among major nations in livestock and milk production, yet the country is importing 89% of its edible oil, which must be reduced.



digits, while relief has already been provided in electricity tariffs for industry. He said that Pakistan's economy is agriculture-based, with agriculture contributing 25% to GDP and ranked second after textiles in exports. He highlighted that from 2013 to 2018, the government resolved severe power and gas crises. Electricity was the biggest challenge for industrial growth while RLNG was introduced to end the gas crisis and economic indicators were improved to protect Pakistan from default. However, the IMF programme requires tough

He said that the business community is a key stakeholder and increasing industrialization and exports is inevitable. Exports must be taken to 100 billion dollars. We must leave behind a strong Pakistan for the next generation. The unnecessary burden of taxes will be removed. There is immense potential in IT, agriculture, and mining & minerals. He emphasized that growth will accelerate after exiting the IMF programme. The government is highly focused and working tirelessly.



Federal Minister for Railways Hanif Abbasi visits LCCI

Pakistan has regained its reputation as a responsible and peace-loving country at the global level. “We are not terrorists but ambassadors of peace.” Since May 10, Pakistan’s international image has improved. Due to our successful foreign policy, the Middle East, China, and the United States are now looking at Pakistan from the same perspective, boosting Pakistan’s respect in the world.

These views were expressed by the Federal Minister for Railways Hanif Abbasi at the Lahore Chamber of Commerce & Industry, LCCI President Faheem-ur-Rehman Saigol, Senior Vice President Tanveer Ahmed Sheikh, Vice President Khurram Lodhi, SAARC Chamber Vice President Mian Anjum Nisar, and Executive Committee members were also present.

Federal Minister for Railways Hanif Abbasi has said that now is the best time and opportunity to improve Pakistan’s economy. The business community should have confidence. When investment comes, industries will run and the country will progress. Hanif Abbasi said that national security ensures national development. “We were once on the ven-

tilator, but not anymore.” He said that cooperation between Railways and the Punjab Government is increasing, and the Prime Minister has given a special task for railway reforms. He said Chambers represent the business community, and people who call taxpayers thieves are themselves thieves. Stakeholders must be taken on board, and extra burden on taxpayers is unacceptable.

LCCI President Faheem-ur-Rehman Saigol said that upgrading railway lines is a welcome and critically important step for economic improvement. He said state-owned enterprises have massive potential but weak governance has caused annual losses of 800 to 900 billion rupees. Pakistan’s economy has derailed and the direction is not right. In such conditions, it is essential to strengthen the transport sector because transport is the oxygen of any economy. He noted that 60% of Pakistan’s goods move to up-country, but due to an ineffec-

tive railway freight system, industries remain under pressure. Industrial zones must be connected with the railway network to reduce logistics costs and make exports competitive.

He said that in Bangladesh, exports are given “ambulance-track” priority, but in Pakistan exporters do not receive such facilities, leading to a rising trade deficit. He appreciated the reopening of Badami Bagh warehouses as a business-friendly decision and said that improving facilities at railway stations is good, but the real benefit will only come when operations and service delivery match global

cities to 2.5 hours. Development works are underway at major stations including Lahore, Karachi, Faisalabad, Rawalpindi, and Rohri. Approval for the Rohri–Karachi upgrade worth 2 billion rupees will be granted in July. The Narowal section and Lodhran station are also being uplifted, while 2500 km plantation from Shahdara to Raiwind will help improve the environment.

He said Pakistan is the only country where passenger revenue is higher than freight revenue, and this imbalance is being corrected. Railway hospitals and schools are being outsourced. The private sec-

SAARC Chamber Vice President Mian Anjum Nisar said that the world has made major advancements in railways, but government policies have severely hurt the private sector. Industry does not get support when facing losses — it must run profitably, otherwise it shuts down. Private sector participation and supportive policies are needed. Hanif Abbasi further said that railway stations and the entire network are being upgraded. A total of 400 km of new track is being laid and 484 km is being uplifted. Two billion rupees have been allocated for upgrading the Lahore–Rawalpindi single track, with plans to reduce travel time between both

tor will be allowed to run its own locomotives with track access. Coal trains are being added while railway will ensure efficient transportation of industrial materials including Reko Diq production. For the uplift of Balochistan railways, 3.5 billion rupees have been provided. Jaffar Express continues to serve the nation despite terrorism threats. Railway revenues are continuously increasing and will keep rising. Hanif Abbasi said that electricity and taxes are the highest in the region and measures will be taken to reduce them. When factories run, the country will run — the economy will recover fast, and important industrial and economic reforms will be introduced soon.

Governor House is a facilitation center for business community: Sardar Saleem Haider

Governor Punjab Sardar Saleem Haider Khan has said that Governor House serves as a facilitation center for the business community and will continue to provide all possible support to businesses. He said that the lack of trust between the government and the business community must end, because policies cannot be effective unless traders are consulted in the policymaking process. He expressed these views while addressing a meeting at the Lahore Chamber of Commerce & Industry.

LCCI President Faheem ur Rehman Saigol delivered the welcome address. Senior Vice President Tanveer Ahmed Sheikh and former SVP Khalid Usman, Executive Committee members Aamir Saeed Mian, Muneeb Monnoo, Rana Nisar, Karamat Awan, Sheikh Fayyaz, Umar Sarfraz, Ali Imran, Abdul Majeed, Imran Saleemi, Amna Randhawa, Firdous Nisar, and Ahad Amin Malik were also present.

The Governor said that the government should formally consult the business community when making economic policies. He said that if policies are made with traders' input, tax collection would also improve significantly. He added that he would meet the Finance Minister and the Chairman of the PPP to strongly present the concerns of the business community. LCCI President Faheem ur Rehman Saigol said that

the biggest challenge facing the country today is the continuous and excessive increase in the cost of doing business. He said that compared to other regional countries, Pakistan has the highest costs of electricity, gas, interest rates, and taxes, which has severely hurt the business environment. He added that Pakistan is also far behind in the global ease-of-doing-business rankings. Removing exporters from the final tax regime has damaged the export sector, while the rise in federal excise duty and raw material cost is forcing multinational companies to leave Pakistan. He said that the government spends between 14 to 18 billion rupees every year on subsidies and grants for state-owned enterprises — an amount even higher than the latest IMF installment. He said that tax reforms were introduced without consultation

with traders, which caused losses to the business community. He suggested focusing on skill development instead of only giving cash assistance under the Benazir Income Support Programme. He also called for a new agriculture policy to meet the country's food requirements.

Egyptian Ambassador Dr. Ihab Abdelhamid visited the Lahore Chamber of Commerce and Industry (LCCI), where he was warmly welcomed by President Faheem-ur-Rehman Saigol, Senior Vice President Tanveer Ahmed Sheikh, and Vice President Khurram Lodhi. He added that there are significant opportunities for cooperation in the tourism sector. Egyptian investors can explore investment in Pakistan's hotels, food streets, and recreational parks. The LCCI assured full support in facilitating such initiatives. Ambassador Dr. Ihab Abdelhamid stated that Pakistan and Egypt share longstanding and deeply rooted relations — religiously, culturally, and economically. He emphasized that Lahore is the economic and cultural hub of Pakistan, and cooperation with the local business community will be further expanded. The Egyptian Ambas-



relations between Pakistan and Egypt. Under Pakistan's "Look Africa" policy, Egypt holds a highly important position as a key partner. He noted that the current bilateral trade stands at around USD 232 million, which is far below the true potential. Pakistani products have strong market opportunities in Egypt, and exploring new markets is essential to increasing exports. Pakistan aims to enhance bilateral trade to USD 2 billion.

sador highlighted that bilateral trade between the two countries is currently around USD 300 million, which needs to be increased. He particularly stressed boosting trade in textiles, cotton, engineering products, processed foods, value-added goods, and the construction sector. He noted that the Suez Canal Economic Zone offers excellent opportunities for Pakistani investors in manufacturing, logistics, textiles, halal food, and various other sectors.

BELGIAN CATALOGUE SHOW AT LCCI

A Belgian Catalogues Exhibition was organized at the Lahore Chamber of Commerce and Industry (LCCI), jointly organized by Ambassador of Belgium Charles Idesbald Van Der Gracht, LCCI President Faheem Ur Rehman Saigol, Senior Vice President Tanveer Ahmed Sheikh, and Vice President Khurram Lodhi. Catalogues of over 100 leading Belgian companies, representing aeronautics, construction, pharmaceuticals, IT, food, environment, steel, logistics, petrochemicals, medical sciences, and other major sectors were showcased for LCCI members and the business

community. Speaking on the occasion, Ambassador Van Der Gracht said that less than a year after his first visit to LCCI, he had witnessed remarkable developments in Pakistan. He noted that the country had endured political protests, wars,

Pakistan and Belgium, he said, have remained steady trading partners. Citing SBP data, he said bilateral trade reached 739 million dollars in 2024–25, with Pakistan exporting 543 million dollars worth of goods—mainly textiles, rice, garments, hosiery and tobacco—while importing 195 million dollars of pharmaceuticals, machinery, polymers, electronic equipment, and steel waste.

The Ambassador reiterated Belgium’s commitment to support economic cooperation, encourage business linkages, and bolster people-to-people exchanges. The LCCI President further expressed hope that this initiative will not remain limited to catalogue displays. “We would like to see regular exchange of trade delegations to further enhance trade and investment ties,” he said.

Senior Vice President Tanveer Ahmed Sheikh said such exhibitions provide a vital platform for Pakistani and Belgian companies to explore partnerships, understand technologies, and identify investment prospects. Vice President Khurram Lodhi added that the Belgian Embassy’s continued engagement with LCCI would help strengthen bilateral economic relations and open new avenues of cooperation.

Ambassador highlights potential to double trade to USD 2.2 billion in 2–3 years with policy support and FTA finalization



Ambassador of Thailand Rongvudhi Virabutr Thursday underscored Thailand's commitment to deepening economic and commercial ties with Pakistan. The Ambassador met with LCCI President Faheem ur Rehman Saigol and Senior Vice President Khurram Lodhi, alongside Executive Committee members Ahtisham-ul-Haq, Waqas Aslam, Ahad Amin Malik, Syed Salman Ali, Firdous Nisar, and Shaban Akhtar at LCCI.

President LCCI highlighted Thailand's global reputation for culture, hospitality, tourism, and industrial advancement. He noted the growing popularity of Thai cuisine and cultural influence in Pakistan's major cities. Faheem ur Rehman Saigol emphasized that Pakistan and Thailand enjoy longstanding and cordial diplomatic relations, characterized by mutual respect and cooperation, and expressed confidence that this meeting would further strengthen economic engagement between the two countries. LCCI President highlighted Pakistan's key exports to Thailand, including sugar, frozen fish, paper and paperboard, alcohol, and medicaments, while noting imports of motor vehicles, artificial staple fibres, natural rubber, tractor parts, and vegetables from Thailand. He stressed the importance of the early

conclusion of the Pakistan–Thailand Free Trade Agreement (FTA) and encouraged further consultations to expedite its finalization.

Thai Ambassador Rongvudhi Virabutr highlighted his tenure in Pakistan since December 2024, noting the country's ongoing economic development and potential for bilateral growth. He said Thailand places the highest importance on strengthening ties with Pakistan and has engaged with major chambers across the country to support the early conclusion of the Thailand–Pakistan FTA. The Ambassador acknowledged concerns over Pakistan's trade deficit with Thailand but emphasized that the FTA should not be limited to trade in goods. Instead, it should cover services and investment flows, offering Pakistan an opportunity to benefit from its strong services sector, which contributes nearly 60 percent to GDP.

Bangladesh High Commissioner Visits LCCI

Bangladesh's High Commissioner Iqbal Hussain Khan announced that Mahan Air is likely to start three weekly flights between Karachi and Dhaka from next month. This would be a major step for trade between the two brotherly nations and a significant leap in strengthening connectivity.

Speaking at the Lahore Chamber of Commerce & Industry (LCCI), the High Commissioner added that the visa process has been simplified. He said visas are now being issued on the joint recommendation of LCCI and the Bangladesh Honorary Consulate in Lahore, adding that visas will be issued to members within three to four days, making travel between the two countries faster and easier.

The High Commissioner was warmly received by LCCI President Faheem ur Rehman Saigol. Senior

Vice President Tanveer Ahmed Sheikh, EC Member Shouban Akhtar, former EC Member Naeem Hanif, and diplomat Mahfujol Hassan from the Bangladesh High Commission were also present at the event.

LCCI President Faheem ur Rehman Saigol emphasized the historical and cultural ties between Pakistan and Bangladesh, describing the two countries as sharing a common heritage. He said Pakistan can increase

rice exports to Bangladesh and also seek guidance from Bangladesh in the garments sector. He noted that both nations have opportunities to collaborate in IT, automobiles, and other industries. Currently, bilateral trade stands at approximately 700 million dollars, but there is potential to increase it to 3 billion dollars over the next few years. President Saigol added that direct flights would further enhance trade relations, and LCCI is ready to provide full support to the Bangladesh High Commission in this regard.

The High Commissioner invited the LCCI President to lead a delegation to Bangladesh, to which President Saigol responded positively, stating that a delegation would visit Bangladesh soon.

Highlighting trade opportunities, High Commissioner Khan said Pakistan can export rice to Bangladesh, while Bangladesh can supply fresh pineapples to Pakistan. He also pointed out significant potential in textiles and ready-made garments.

He further mentioned that a direct cargo shipping

service will soon be launched. While a cargo service between the two countries has been operational since last December, rising trade demand now requires a dedicated direct cargo route.

In the education sector, the High Commissioner encouraged both countries to collaborate.

Heavy tax burden on Large-Scale Manufacturing affects exports: Dr. Hafeez A. Pasha

As much as 60 percent of Pakistan's total tax revenue comes from a single sector, the large-scale manufacturing sector. This highlights the imbalance in the country's tax system. The burden on this single sector is four times higher than on the rest of the economy, leaving it struggling to breathe. As a result, the manufacturing sector is moving in the negative rather than showing growth each year. This was stated by former Federal Finance Minister Dr. Hafiz A. Pasha during a speech at the Lahore Chamber of Commerce. LCCI President Faheem

He added that investment in Pakistan has sharply declined. Today, investment in the large-scale manufacturing sector is much lower than it was 25 years ago. The biggest concern is that the depreciating capital stock is not being replenished, which hampers the sustainable growth of the manufacturing sector. LCCI President Faheem ur Rehman Saigol said that Pakistan has not properly utilized its economic potential. The challenges the country faces today are not caused by external factors but by poor policies and governance. He noted that

Dr. Pasha noted that Pakistan has several sectors with high income potential, such as agriculture, yet the tax revenue from these sectors remains minimal. Only one percent of landowners possess 22 percent of the best agricultural land, but the revenue collected from the agriculture sector is negligible. Following IMF directives, the government has estimated just PKR 4 billion in tax collection from the agriculture sector next year — extremely low compared to PKR 4,500 billion collected from the

Government must consult traders before demolishing markets: LCCI President Faheem Ur Rehman Saigol



A large delegation from Circular Road, Sarai Sultan, Shaheed Ganj and more than 15 markets knocked the door of the Lahore Chamber of Commerce and Industry (LCCI) and voiced strong concern over the government's proposed Lehar Project, which aims to demolish Circular Road and its adjoining commercial areas. The delegation met President LCCI Faheem Ur Rehman Saigol, Senior Vice President Tanveer Ahmed Sheikh, Vice President Khurram Lodhi, SAARC Chamber Vice President Mian Anjum Nisar, former LCCI President Muhammad Ali Mian, Executive Committee Member Rana Nisar and other office bearers. The delegation was led by Patron-in-Chief of the Muttahida Action Committee Malik Khalid Gujjar, accompanied by President Malik Shahid Aslam and the presidents of more than 15 markets. Participants included Haji Tahir Naveed, Shahid Azmat, Nabeel Mahmood Tariq, Haji Khalid Rasheed, Bao Irfan, Farhan Butt, Chaudhry Maqsood, Basit Shahid, Ziauddin Butt, Malik Yaseen, Chaudhry Fazal Ahmed, Muhammad Islam, Haji Altaf, Mian Waqar, Khizar Hayat, Muhammad Altaf, Sheikh Siddique, Syed Hassan Bukhari, Hafeez Ahmed Khan, Rana Mujahid Islam, Aamir Nasir Butt, Zahir Naveed and others. LCCI President Faheem Ur Rehman Saigol stated that the decision to demolish Circular Road and the

adjoining markets is unilateral and taken without consultation with the business community. He announced that the Chamber will form a special committee comprising representatives from all affected markets to hold formal negotiations with the government. He emphasized that hundreds of thousands of families depend on these markets, at a time when unemployment is already rising sharply. He assured that LCCI will take this matter to every relevant forum and seek a practical solution. SAARC Chamber Vice President Mian Anjum Nisar said that damaging people's livelihoods in this manner is totally unacceptable. He said that unilateral actions are inappropriate and said, "We will not allow anyone to trample traders' rights. The affected traders are here, and we stand with them." Senior Vice President Tanveer Ahmed Sheikh said the government should ease traders' problems instead of adding to them. Vice President Khurram Lodhi suggested preparing a concrete plan to present to the government as a path forward. Malik Khalid Gujjar said the government must understand the seriousness of the matter. "Even while consultations were ongoing, the Bird Market was demolished. We have been doing business there for 50 years. Do not call us encroachers or a mafia — we are traders, and we will stand for our rights."

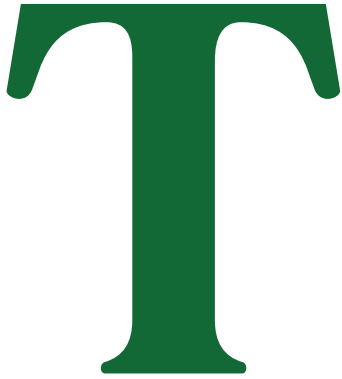

of Metrobus routes, development of areas on both sides of the river, 11% blue infrastructure, eight wastewater treatment plants, bridges, dams, and channelization projects. He assured that the RUDA will fully cooperate with LCCI to address the problems of industries in the Saggian area. LCCI President Faheem ur Rehman Saigol said that industries in the Saggian area have been facing uncertainty over the past few months. He noted that the RUDA has periodically sent notices to property holders and factory owners, asking them to pay 20% RDA charges based on the current DC rates and to commercialize the area. He argued that this area was developed under a self-help model, properties were purchased at very low prices, and it still remains underdeveloped. He questioned how 20 to 30-foot pathways are being commercialized under these laws. He added that lands purchased for 12 to 15 lakh rupees per kanal are now being asked to pay 75 to 85 lakh rupees per kanal according to current DC rates, which is impossible for most people.
