## 3. APPROVAL OF PREVIOUS MINUTES OF EC MEETING

- 3.1 The debate on Agenda Item No. 3 lasted for more than 50 minutes. Mr Muhammad Yousaf Shah, Rana Tariq Mahboob, Mr Haris Ateeq, Chaudhry Wajid Ali, Mr Usman Malik, Mr Khalid Mahmood and Malik Muhammad Nadeem argued for the deferment of the minutes of the meeting held on January 25, 2023. They were concerned of the recording of minutes and coverage of the issues debated previously. They demanded deferment of minutes, re-recordings and presentations to EC for approval.
- 3.2 Mr Kashif Anwar, President of LCCI, directed the Secretary-General to include missing points highlighted by the Executive Committee members but was strongly opposed by the members noted above. Mr Zafar Mahmood Ch, Senior Vice President, Mr. Adnan Khalid Butt, Vice President, Mr Khadim Hussain, Sheikh Muhammad Ibrahim, Mr Mujahid Maqsood Butt, Ms Fareeha Younas, Mr Arjumand Maqsood, Raja Hassan Akhtar, Mr Jabbar Khalid and Mr Muhammad Tauqeer Malik also participated in the debate and supported the point of view regarding addition of missing points as proposed by the Chair.
- 3.3 While giving his final verdict and wrapping up the lengthy discussion, the Chair announced the approval of the minutes and directed the Secretary-General to add the missing points after consultation with the members and present them in the next EC meeting.

- 3.4 Mr Muhammad Yousaf Shah asked about the approval of six million rupees for Seminars, Conferences and Exhibitions and referred to the rule relating to the approval and authority of the President, Executive Committee and General Meeting. He urged to follow the Articles of Association while approving financial matters. He mentioned that the President can only spend 50000 rupees, and the executive committee has the power to grant approval up to one million rupees. In case any approval above a million rupees is authority of General Meeting.
- 3.5 After a brief discussion on the matter, the Chair directed Secretary-General to take legal opinion on the matter and the rules and procedures mentioned in the Memorandum and Articles of Associations. He directed the Secretary-General to strictly follow the Legal limits of financial powers of the President and Executive Committee after seeking Legal Advice.

#### **4. IMPLEMENTATION OF THE DECISIONS OF THE EC**

- 4.1 The Chair announced the approval of Agenda Item No 4 after a brief clarification sought by Chaudhry Wajid Ali about the presentation of RUDA report to all EC Members.

#### **5. LIST OF ACTIVITIES**

- 5.1 The Chair approved Agenda Item No. 5 after a brief discussion which was participated by Mr Haris Ateeq, Mr Zafar Mahmood Chaudry, SVP LCCI, Ms Shamim Akhter, and Secretary-General. The Chair directed the Secretary-General to write a letter to all members of the Executive Committee for their sector-specific concerns, a list of proposed seminars, and any other activity which they want to organize in the Lahore Chamber of Commerce and Industry during the next eight months of his tenure. The President emphasized submitting all proposals in writing to be addressed to the Secretary-General with a copy to him for information. The observations during the discussion are given below:

5.2 Mr Haris Ateeq sought clarification about not inviting the Executive Committee on the visit of Secretary Industries to the LCCI a few days back. Mr Zafar Mahmood Chaudhry, SVP, stressed ensuring the proper and timely circulation of information/invitations relating to the visits of government officials, notables and dignitaries among the members of the Executive Committee. He was of the view that the Executive Committee comprises two partners Groups with equal stakes in all affairs of the Chamber and we feel that a proper invitation mechanism should be devised to ensure the presence of relevant businessmen in such meetings by the secretariat. He also showed his displeasure on news in the media that only three people were sitting during the meeting. He directed to use all available means including telephone calls for ensuring the presence of a maximum number of executive committee members in high-profile meetings.

5.3 Mr Zafar Mahmood Chaudhry, SVP, said that all the standing committees should prepare bullet points containing issues discussed in these meetings for office-bearers to keep them updated on day-to-day discussions on trade and industry, which will enable them to highlight while talking to decision-makers and media. The Secretary-General agreed to the suggestion.

5.4 Ms Shamim Akhtar said in the current challenging business environment, the LCCI management should speed up its efforts to give a positive signal about how the leadership of the business community is working hard for the betterment of its community. She also stressed that as a business support organization, the LCCI should perform as a bridge between trade & industry and the Government. She advised acting as an advocate of the business community, not as the government spokesperson.

## 6. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTS

6.1 The House approved Agenda item No. 6 (Statement of Accounts) without any change or rejection in the document circulated with the notice of meeting after a brief discussion based on the understanding and validations of the figures from the President, SVP and Secretary-General.

- 6.2 Mr Khalid Mehmood sought the current status and update of an amount of 73 million shown as advance tax in the Statement of Accounts. The Secretary-General informed that during Mian Nauman Kabir's tenure, Andrabi and Gabriel, one of the leading law firms, was engaged to pursue LCCI advance tax cases which were pending for the last many years at different courts of Law. Mr Naveed A. Andrabi, Sumair Saeed Ahmad, Khurram Saleem and Ghulam Ahmad Ansari appeared before the Learned Division Bench of the Honourable Lahore High Court. The learned Division Bench allows the tax reference filed by the LCCI and answered the questions of Law in favour of LCCI, the Secretary-General added.
- 6.3 Mr Kashif Anwar, President of LCCI, appreciated the efforts of the former President, Senior Vice President, Vice President and Executive Committee for hiring the most suitable lawyers (Andrabi and Gabriel and Akhter Ali and Associates) and acknowledged the efforts of the preceding regime as a milestone in the history of LCCI. He expressed the hope that soon we will receive an exemption certificate under Section 236 of the Income Tax Ordinance.
- 6.4 Mr Haris Ateeq thanked Mr Kashif Anwar for acknowledging the role of the previous regime and informed the House that during the last tenure, LCCI has also succeeded in getting relief in the Property Tax case through the proper channel.
- 6.5 Mr Zafar Mahmood Chaudhry, SVP LCCI, shared that he found a miscalculation in the collection of LESCO bills from tenants. The LCCI was only charging electricity prices to tenants since 2012 on the plea that taxes will be adjusted later on. He said, "I have directed the Finance Department to divide the total bill amount by the units consumed" as currently, the cost of one unit of electricity is around 69 rupees and LCCI is charging only 25 to 30 rupees per unit from tenants. He requested for appropriate decision by the President and House. The Chair agreed to the point of SVP and approved passing on all taxes according to the units consumed.

- 6.6 Mr Khalid Mehmood sought clarification on figures related to the salaries and budget figures in this head of the account sheet. He said there is a difference between budgeted amounts Vs Actual payments, which he wants to understand. Rana Tariq Mehboob also participated in the discussion and proposed revisiting the figures to identify whether it is a miscalculation or anything else.

## 7. MINUTES OF THE STANDING COMMITTEES MEETINGS

- 7.1 The House approved Agenda item No. 7 excluding the minutes of the standing committee on Fresh Fruits and Vegetables due to late submission in the meeting. Mian Rehman Aziz Chan pointed out that we cannot discuss or approve any minutes which are presented directly in the EC meeting. The Chair agreed to the point of the former Senior Vice President and returned the minutes for resubmission in the next meeting.
- 7.2 Mr Haris Ateeq appreciated Ms Fareeha Zeeshan, Raja Hassan Akhter, Mr Khadam Hussain, Ibrahim Sheikh, Mr Jabbar Khalid and Malik Nadeem for holding very fruitful meetings of their standing committees and positively engaging members in productive activities. He objected to the nomination of Rao Khurshid Ali as the Convener Standing Committee on International Affairs and Delegations and demanded immediate replacement of the Convener with any suitably experienced and export-oriented member of the executive committee. He referred Memorandum and Articles of Association and tradition of LCCI while allocating such important standing committees in the past. He said that Rao Khurshid Ali cannot lead LCCI delegations. He suggested developing concept note before proposing any delegation of LCCI members. Mr Haris Ateeq proposed to disapprove the minutes of the Standing Committee on International Affairs and Delegations. Chaudhry Wajid Ali seconded Mr Haris Ateeq's point of view.

- 7.3 Mr Muhammad Yousaf Shah highlighted the allocation of two standing committees to Rao Khurshid Ali and declared it a violation of the decision that one member can head only one standing committee. Mr Muhammad Waseem Yousaf proposed review of allocation of all standing committees to avoid any discussion in future. Mr Muhammad Usman Malik also supported Haris Ateeq, and Muhammad Yousaf Shah and called for priority to Executive Committee while allocating important standing committees.
- 7.4 Muhammad Usman Malik also seconded the ideas of Mr Haris Ateeq regarding the preference of Executive Committee members at the time of nomination as Conveners and the allocation of one standing committee to one person. He criticized restrictions imposed by the management of LCCI relating to the closing time of LCCI premises and proposed to encourage healthy criticism for strengthening LCCI as an institution.
- 7.5 Mr Khadam Hussain registered his disagreement with the points highlighted by Mr Haris Ateeq and said that there is no such concept of important standing committees in his mind. He believes that we all have to work for the betterment of trade and industry. If any committee is performing well, it is successful irrespective of its category in the eyes of members. He agreed to the point of heading two committees by one Convener and offered to surrender one committee in the light of the decision of the President. The Chair after listening to the comments of members directed the Secretary-General to ask all members about their priorities before taking any further decisions.
- 7.6 Mr Haris Ateeq clarified his point of view after listening to the remarks of Mr Khadam Hussain about importance and again demanded withdrawal of Convenership of the Standing Committee on International Affairs and Delegations. Mian Attique ur Rehman strongly reacted to the remarks of Mr Usman Malik about the performance of LCCI during the current tenure and suggested talking to the President as Mr Kashif Anwar is working under an open door policy and ready to talk to everyone at any time.

- 7.7 Ms Fareeha Younas shared that her experience and perception have been very positive since joining LCCI as a member of the Executive Committee. She said that the Lahore Chamber of Commerce and Industry's performance is very impressive under the leadership of Mr Kashif Anwar and her efforts towards women's empowerment have been widely appreciated among the trade and industry. She also paid rich tributes to the President, Senior Vice President, Vice President and members of the EC for their positive support and respect as a woman member. She said I received many telephone calls from her friends that Lahore Chamber is not a suitable place for women, and a lot of politics, leg pulling and grouping exist.
- 7.8 Mr Khalid Mahmood pleaded for preference to EC members while allocating standing committees and LCCI nominations in government departments' advisory committees. He was of the view that every member sitting in this room has developed a unique working relationship in his/her business dealings and proposed to appoint or nominate them as focal persons to take full advantage of their working relationship in government departments like FBR, Police, FIA, Punjab Food Authority, Board of Investment, Industries department and LESCO. The Chair appreciated the proposal and directed Secretary-General to present a list of nominations by LCCI during the last five years in the next meeting.
- 7.9 Muhammad Usman Malik while correcting the remarks of Ms Fareeha Younus about the bad reputation of LCCI in the past said that there is always room for improvement in the performance of any institution and LCCI is one of them. He proposed to withdraw the word "a bad reputation". Using a cricketing term he said a cricket player has the capacity to score runs but in some innings, he scores 325 and sometimes 25 runs only. He asked for balanced policies for providing a level playing field to all and offered to extend support of the Executive Committee members according to the desire of the President. Mr Muhammad Usman Malik also expressed concern about thin participation of EC in important meetings. The Chair directed Secretary-General to review the process of sharing messages/invitations among the Executive Committee

members and directed them to communicate through telephone calls from President's Secretariat to maximize the participation of EC members in high-profile meetings.

- 7.10 Mr Zafar Mahmood Chaudhry, Senior Vice President, LCCI supported President and said that he already has directed Malik Muhammad Asif, Additional Secretary of the President Secretariat to take instructions from office-bearers on the list of guests on regular basis. "We are here to represent each and every industry and lacs of traders along with 33000 active members of the LCCI", he added. He especially acknowledged services of female members of the executive committee and their contribution towards women empowerment through Women Resource Center in LCCI and also admitted that being a democratic trade body we are blend of all such features.
- 7.11 Sheikh Muhammad Ibrahim said this is his third term as a member executive committee and he was awarded a standing committee for the first time. He was of the view that ethics are more important than anything else in his life and he always prefers moral values more than designations and titles.
- 7.12 Mr Khamis Saeed acknowledged the PIAF – Founders Alliance leadership for reposing confidence in him for the last 25 years by appointing him Convener of the Standing Committee on Paper and Paper Board trade irrespective of the status of EC member and for the last 10 years he also was looking after LCCI - Traffic Police Liaison. He offered to leave one committee and suggested not to write letters to members for surrendering one Standing Committee as a token of respect. He requested LCCI support for the restoration of driving tests in the Lahore Chamber building instead of going to Manawan. He applauded the positive behaviour of the President in today's meeting and understanding among office-bearers. Mr Muhammad Wasim Yousaf pointed out missing Purchase Committee minutes in the list of standing committees. Purchase Committee is an ad hoc committee that's why it is not reported, the Secretary-General clarified.

- 7.13 Ms Shamim Akhtar stressed the need for a candid discussion and the productive role of standing committees by focusing on members' capacity building, focus on issues and workable ideas. She requested to be precise in talking as time is precious for everyone.
- 7.14 Mr Muhammad Nadeem Malik applauded the behaviour of the President while conducting today's meeting but criticized an incident that took place in the Purchase Committee meeting. He said we all are elected representatives of the business community expecting equal respect and freedom of speech, which we experienced last year. "Our mandate should be respected for the betterment of this institution", he added. He seconded the points mentioned by Mr Haris Ateeq.
- 7.15 Mr Haris Ateeq said that he never endorsed the two standing committees idea but he reiterated revoking the Standing Committee on International Fairs, Exhibitions and Delegations and its allotment to some other suitable EC member or any former Office-Bearers.
- 7.16 Mr Muhammad Yousaf Shah asked why his application for the Standing Committee on Membership was refused without any consultation with him. He was also critical of office-bearers for appointing themselves as Convener of many standing committees and demanded reallocating these committees to members of the executive committees. He questioned the minutes of the Standing Committee on Human Resources and the hiring of staff. The Chair asked Mian Rehman Aziz Chan for an interpretation of the rules while considering the recent appointments. Mian Rehman Aziz refrained from giving any verdict. The Secretary-General said we have obtained a legal opinion on the issue and our actions are well within the limits of rules and regulations.
- 7.17 Talking about the minutes of the HR Committee Rana Tariq Mehboob asked Senior Vice President and Vice President about their presence at the meeting and termed the appointments by President as illegal and in violation of HR rules/procedures. Both SVP and Vice President clarified that they were not

present in the meeting. The Chair said the members who attended the meeting have signed the minutes and did not claim that they attended the meeting and directed the Secretary-General for correction.

7.18 Mr Zafar Mahmood Chaudhry, SVP, LCCI delivered a long speech, in which he claimed to be an equal partner with 50 per cent stakes in all matters of LCCI. He talked about the basic spirit of PIAF – Founders Alliance during the last 21 years to work as a family. He refuted the impression that everything is going on smoothly in Chamber and cited the example of how the President withdrew the notice of the Purchase Committee meeting issued by him without his consultation. He said as a protest he surrendered standing committees allocated to him but President did not realize his feelings. He said that Mian Ashraf, Chairman, of Founders Group, told him that standing committees would be equally shared between alliance partners. He stressed the need for fair treatment with PIAF – Founders representatives in standing committees to have unanimous decisions. He sought 100 per cent implementation of unanimous decisions of the Executive Committee to move on smoothly. He also criticized the staff's assertiveness while dealing with members of the executive committee and shared his dialogue with M. Asif Ali, PS to President and the impression given to the President that SVP wants to check President's mail whereas my intention was only to know and follow President's approach towards economic issues. He offered to amicably settle all disputes for the functioning of this House and sweet memories of this tenure.

7.19 Rana Tariq Mehboob again asked to withdraw the HR Standing Committee minutes as the Senior Vice President and Vice President representing 50 per cent of stakeholders (PIAF) were not consulted while taking the decision of hiring staff by the Committee.

7.20 The Chair asked Secretary-General to withdraw the HR Committee minutes.

7.21 Mr Khalid Mahmood invited attention towards a decision of EC about the suspension of the EC meeting for the Prayer Break and said today we left for

prayer and we know nothing about what happened during our absence. He demands the suspension of the meeting and the implementation of the earlier decision in EC.

- 7.22 Sh. Muhammad Ibrahim requested office-bearers to discuss points with an open mind as you three are the real stakeholders. The Chair while concluding the debate expressed the hope that he will take everyone into the loop as we are family and equal partners in LCCI.
- 7.23 Mr Mujahid Maqsood Butt while showing his displeasure said that the current debate shows that a few members want to fix President Mr Kashif Anwar to satisfy their ego.
- 7.24 Mr Malik Muhammad Nadeem said that we have to choose one direction between the golden traditions of PIAF – Founders Alliance or following rules and laws while taking decisions. He said that during the last 21 years, the Alliance has been following the path of mutual respect, understanding and decision once taken are acceptable to everyone. He endorsed the points of the Vice President and Mr Haris Ateeq to take a decision from the House about the standing committee status. The Chair disallowed the suggestion and clarified that he doesn't make a precedent of reverting the President's decision.
- 7.25 The Secretary-General humbly requested the House to review its decision relating to the newly hired employees. He prayed not to dismiss the minutes and employees in such a slipshod manner. He also drew attention of the EC members towards the harsh economic conditions and humanitarian grounds.
- 7.26 To this, the Chair seconded the opinion of the Secretary General and announced the withdrawal of his order relating to minutes of HR Committee. Certain EC members suggested reviewing the issue after consultation among the President, Senior Vice President and Vice President, to which the Chair

acceded. He also agreed to reach an understanding by 31<sup>st</sup> January, 2023 after discussion/review within next five days.

- 7.27 Mr. Arjumand Maqsood endorsed and appreciated the President LCCI.
- 7.28 Mr Muhammad Yousaf Shah repeatedly questioned the hiring process and implementation of previous minutes of EC. The SVP requested to close the debate as all his concerns are addressed in the meeting. Mr. Haris Ateeq appreciated the humbleness of the Chair while dealing with hard hitting remarks by the committee members.
- 7.29 Mr Adnan Khalid Butt, Vice President, LCCI, called for members' positive contributions and requested to make a business activity plan for discussion in the EC. He stressed bringing sector-specific issues for debate from all respected members of the Executive Committee as office-bearers don't have knowledge of every sector of trade and industry. He said that we want to create win-win situation for Alliance partners.

## **8 ANY OTHER ITEM**


- 8.1 The debate under the agenda point was actively participated by Muhammad Ibrahim Sheikh, Zafar Mahmood Chaudhry, Senior Vice President, Mr Kashif Anwar, President, Mr Haris Ateeq, Mujahid Maqsood Butt, Mr Muhammad Waseem Yousaf, Rana Tariq Mahboob, Mr Muhammad Riaz-ul-Hassan, Mr Jabbar Khalid, Mr Asim Pervaiz Siddiqi, Muhammad Usman Malik, Mr Muhammad Yousaf Shah, Chaudhry Wajid Ali, Muhammad Nadeem Malik, Mr Rizwan Haider, Raaha Hassan Akhtar and Ms Fareeha Zeeshan.

The following decisions were made unanimously.

- 8.2. Collection of issues and solutions of trade and industry in writing from Executive Committee Members
- 8.3. Meeting with the Governor State Bank of Pakistan for the solution of problems being faced by industry and general importers

- 8.4. Invited renowned economists to discuss economic issues
- 8.5. Executive Committee agenda should be based on sector-specific economic issues, challenges and workable solutions. All EC members would be asked to send their issues in writing to the Secretary-General, LCCI
- 8.6. Business Think Tank constituted. Mr Zafar Mahmood Chaudhry, Senior Vice President, LCCI appointed as Convener. Think Tank will comprise EC members who will meet weekly and send their recommendations to the Executive Committee
- 8.7. Provincial Governments are misusing their authority, which should be taken up at the highest forums
- 8.8. All the Executive Committee asked to share their list of government officials for extending invitations to visit LCCI.
- 8.9. Meeting of the Executive Committee with Mian Muhammad Shahbaz Sharif, Prime Minister of Pakistan should be arranged to share concerns of the business community either in Lahore or in Islamabad.
- 8.10. Oil marketing companies are facing problems that need to be discussed with the concerned ministry.
- 8.11. Discussion on Export promotion should be the agenda item in EC meetings
- 8.12. There is a dire need to stop housing societies, as the societies are eating up precious agricultural land
- 8.13. All Punjab Chambers conventions should be arranged to discuss ways and means to improve economic conditions. Mr Nadeem Malik was nominated as Chairman of the Committee for making all arrangements in this regard
