1. Recitation from the Holy Quran

The meeting started with the recitation from the Holy Quran.

2. Leave of Absence

3. Approval of the Minutes of Previous Meeting

The house approved minutes of the meeting held on 7.12.2021, with following observations:

- 3.1 Mr. Tahir Manzoor Chaudhry said that in the previous executive committee meeting held on 7.12.2021, he had highlighted the issue of NIL income tax returns and proposed to exclude such members from the voters list. He emphasized the need for receiving income tax returns instead of acknowledgement to ascertain their turnover. Without complete information, it is challenging to determine the turnover and status of membership defined under Trade Organizations Rules 2013. The Chair agreed to include the point in the minutes.
- 3.2 The Chair congratulated the Executive Committee on the advent of the Islamic month of Rajab. While replying to the points, the Chair said that although we have discussed these points in detail. Still, we can't ask members for their income tax returns under the Trade Organizations Rules 2013. The rules only allow a copy of the acknowledgment of the income tax return at the renewal stage.
- 3.3 On the direction of the President, the Secretary-General clarified that the membership department had already started scrutiny of files but we have to wait till the end of March to collect the data.
- 3.4 Mr. Tahir Manzoor Chaudhry stressed for inclusion of his point in minutes and cited the example of a list of companies presented to him during his tenure as Vice President by the Membership Department before elections in 2021. He proposed collecting income tax returns from member companies. The Chair agreed to the suggestion and directed to include it in the executive committee meeting minutes.
- 3.5 The Chair asked for any other observation from the House and, after receiving no comment, announced the unanimous approval of Agenda item 3.

4. Implementation of the decisions of the EC

The Executive Committee approved the "Implementation Report" on the decisions of the previous Minutes of the Executive Committee meeting. The discussion on the Implementation Report is being reported below.

- 4.1 Mr. Tahir Manzoor Chaudhry said that no notification was issued despite the decision in the previous executive committee meeting to constitute an ad-hoc committee on accounts. The Chair clarified that it was part of the discussion, but no decision was made. The Chair, after a brief discussion on the topic, agreed to constitute a 6-member ad-hoc committee on Accounts.
- 4.2 Mr. Tahir Manzoor Chaudhry referred to point number 6.3 of the previous EC meeting minutes relating to the appointment of CFO, Exemption Certificate, and property tax issues, which were not mentioned in the Implementation Report circulated along with the agenda of the EC.

- 4.3 The Secretary-General, while replying to the identical points highlighted by Mr. Tahir Manzoor Chaudhry and Mr. Mubashar Naseer Butt, said he would try to address all their questions collectively to present a clear picture of these issues. The Secretary-General noted that after clear instructions in the previous EC meeting, we were religiously following taxation issues, which are divided into three categories:
- LCCI Appeals pending in Lahore High Court against the decisions of Income Tax Department for period starting from 1993 to 2003 and Income Tax cases from 2004 to 2018 at different stages in FBR
 - Issuance of Exemption Certificate for LCCI
 - Property Tax Notice issued to LCCI for recovery
- 4.4 For the cases in Lahore High Court for 1993 to 2003, the services of a very senior advocate and expert of taxation laws, Syed Naveed Andrabi of Andrabi & Gabriel, have been hired. As a first step, he got separated the Lahore Chamber of Commerce and Industry cases from a bundle of cases pending in LHC related to the Stock Exchange and others.
- 4.5 While clarifying the second point, the Secretary-General said that another very well reputed Law firm M/s GM Associates has been engaged for an Exemption Certificate for LCCI. They have initiated working for a certificate from FBR subsidiary PSP, which is mandatory under the Not-For-Profit Organization status.
- 4.6 While briefing on the property tax issue, the Secretary-General informed the House that Senior Vice President is keenly looking after this issue. Another lawyer has been engaged to take up the matter with concerned authorities.
- 4.7 Mr. Tahir Manzoor Chaudhry questioned why this activity was missed in the Implementation Report? The Secretary-General replied that all activities were in-process and the outcome had not been achieved, so it was not mentioned in the implementation report.
- 4.8 Talking about the appointment of the CFO, the Secretary-General informed the House that an advertisement has already been published in Daily Dawn and Daily Jang for the post.
- 4.9 Mr. Tahir Manzoor Chaudhry requested the Chair to include previous applications received for jobs in the current list of applicants, to which the Chair agreed. The Chair also assured that all hiring would be routed through the HR Committee of LCCI.
- 4.10 Mr. Tariq Mehboob requested the Chair to re-invite Chairperson IPO to the LCCI for discussion on the issues relating to the availability of Registrar in Lahore, trademark registration, and patent registration problems. The Chair directed Secretary-General to ensure the visit of the IPO Chairperson.
- 4.11 Mr. Khalid Mehmood suggested calling off interviews of new membership applicants to save time. He called for online interview facility for members.

- 4.12 The discussion on LCCI foreign currency account was participated by Mr. Tahir Manzoor Chaudhry, Mr. Nadeem Qureshi, Mian Attiq-ur-Rehman, and Mian Tariq Rehman. They agreed that dormant foreign currency could be made operational after receiving foreign remittances to this account. In contrast, Mr. Mubashar Naseer Butt disagreed with their point of view and requested the Chair for a clear verdict of the bank on the LCCI foreign currency account operations.
- 4.13 Mr. Abdul Wadood Alvi thanked the Chair and asked for an update on activities under the banner of "100 Years Celebrations of LCCI," as mentioned in the Implementation Report. The Chair, while replying to the question of Mr. Abdul Wadood Alvi, said that Mr. Mardan Ali Zaidi would be given time at the end of the meeting in the "Any Other Item" session for the update on arrangements.
- 4.14 Malik Riaz Iqbal requested efforts to resolve traffic congestion in the Gajjomata area, which is not possible without a roundabout on the road. For the construction of the roundabout, we have to contact LDA and Civil Works Organization (CWO) as the deployment of traffic wardens would not be a solution to the traffic jams. The Chair agreed and directed to put up efforts for early settlement of the issue by involving LDA and CWO heads.
- 4.15 The Chair, after considering points highlighted by the Executive Committee members, announced the approval of Agenda item No. 4

5. List of Activities

The House approved the List of Activities for the period from 20.11.2021 to 25.2.2022 with appreciation.

- 5.1 The Executive Committee members appreciated the documentary prepared on the Lahore Chamber of Commerce and Industry events during the last two months. Mr. Haris Ateeq, Vice President, LCCI, informed the House that during the period, 147 activities were conducted in LCCI, which included seven meetings with diplomats and Ambassadors, 16 seminars, and training programs. He congratulated the Executive Committee for its success in organizing many events in the Lahore Chamber of Commerce and Industry.

6. Statement of Accounts

- 6.1 While opening the debate on Agenda Item Number 6, Mr. Tahir Manzoor Chaudhry said that cash flow was better at the end of his tenure than the figures shown in the "Statement of Accounts" presented to the EC members. He sought clarification on the headings of Cash and Bank Balances, where the closing balance has declined from Rs. 11,327,600/- in October 2021 to Rs 41,49,126/- in December 2021. He was concerned over the state of "Advances, Payments and other Receivables" and expenses mentioned against Seminars and Conferences in the statement of accounts. The Secretary-General responding to Mr. Tahir Manzoor Chaudhry's points, said that the decline in cash was due to the payment of salary to the staff.

- 6.2 Mr. Haris Ateeq, Vice President, LCCI, clarified that the "Statement of Accounts" receivables are an outstanding issue that needs immediate attention. Giving detail of receivables, the Vice President said that exceptional amounts are pending in CAC Conference, Export Trophy Awards, and LCCI Achievements Awards held during 2019-2021. He proposed to constitute an ad-hoc committee to decide the pending payments. Answering the questions of high expenses under the Seminars and Conferences heading, he said the increase was due to Extraordinary General Meeting (EGM) held during the period under review, which incurred expenses of Rs. 493,000/-. The Vice President presented a positive picture of LCCI's financial health by mentioning earnings from three seminars organized on "Pakistan Single Window," which fetched very handsome amount for LCCI. He said now we have started Annual Membership renewals. The Vice President added that an increase in the issuance of visa recommendation letters positively impacted our accounts. He also applauded the efforts of the staff of LCCI to organize these events.
- 6.3 Mian Nauman Kabir, President LCCI, also added to the comments of the Vice President about the good financial prospects of LCCI in the future and said that now almost all seminars are being organized on a self-finance basis without spending any penny from LCCI income.
- 6.4 Mr. Khalid Mehmood observed that "Income from Services to Members" shows a decline in December 2021 compared to the receipts in October 2021, which has dropped to Rs. 66,22,152/- from Rs. 99,90,606/- in October 2021. The Secretary-General informed that November and December are considered dull periods compared to other months in a year, and the current year is not an exception. He was hopeful of revival in January 2022.
- 6.5 Mr. Mubashar Naseer Butt asked about the management of the Provident Fund account and deduction percentage, employees' contribution, exemption certificate, and maintenance of separate bank account for the Fund. The Finance Department head clarified that LCCI deducts 10 percent of basic salary, maintains a different bank account, and has an exemption certificate for provident fund account.
- 6.6 To a question asked by Mr. Tahir Manzoor Chaudhry, Mr. Haris Ateeq, Vice President, replied that out of Rs. 16,40,250/- under receivables an amount of Rs. 300,000/- has been received, and the remaining receivables are due on advertisements published in "Lahore Chamber News." LCCI Diary of 2022, which will be collected shortly.
- 6.7 Mr. Jabbar Khalid proposed to renegotiate with banks about the rate of return on LCCI fixed deposits when banks are offering enhanced rates on term deposits. The Chair appreciated the proposal and invited wisdom from the House. Mian Tariq Rehman and Mr. Muhammad Nadeem Qureshi supported the idea and requested the Chair to renegotiate with banks for a better return on investments. The Chair agreed and directed the Finance & Accounts department to work out better rates on LCCI investments.

- 6.8 Mr. Khalid Mehmood referred to Notes number 4 & 7 of the Balance Sheet as "Advances, prepayments, and other receivables" and "Security on Visa Recommendation Letters," which reflect an amount of Rs. 69.80 million and Rs. 36.30 million respectively. He wants clarity on the issues for a better understanding of the House. Secretary-General replied that due to the sensitivity of the matter and the involvement of massive amounts, the LCCI had hired a very experienced and qualified lawyer to deal with pending taxation issues.
- 6.9 The Chair, while adding to the Secretary-General's comments, said that after identifying the issue in the last EC meeting, we are seriously following 15 taxation cases at all forums, including Lahore High Court and FBR Tribunals. He shared with the House that a retired Chief Commissioner is appointed to deal with taxation issues. He invited Mr. Khalid Mahmood to participate in the Standing Committee on Finance & Taxation in LCCI to share his ideas. The Chair again requested the Secretary-General to brief the developments relating to pending taxation cases.
- 6.10 Responding to the questions of Mr. Khalid Mehmood, the Secretary-General said that, as discussed earlier, we are following the taxation cases with complete devotion and dedication. Mr. Haris Ateeq, Vice President, LCCI, said that the amount is like a revolving fund that deals with security deposited by members as guarantee money against issuing visa recommendation letters. This figure keeps changing daily depending upon new applicants' deposits and withdrawals. The Secretary-General informed the House that he discussed the issue with President LCCI. We did not apply the decision after considering financial, political, and legal fallout.
- 6.11 Mr. Tahir Manzoor Chaudhry reiterated that the logic behind the decision was to identify those people who misused the LCCI visa recommendation letters and skipped in different countries.
- 6.12 Mr. Rehman Aziz Chan, Senior Vice President, said that the worthy Vice President is vigorously pursuing the issue.
- 6.13 Mr. Mardan Ali Zaidi invited the attention of the House towards the approval of the EC decision about security deposits pending with LCCI for a long time. The Chair delayed further discussion till "Any other item."
- 6.14 Mr. Tahir Manzoor Chaudhry suggested calling the Executive Committee meeting after a month or directing the Standing Committees to prepare proposals considering the time frame of EC meetings. The Chair appreciated both the points highlighted by Mr. Tahir Manzoor Chaudhry and directed standing committees to observe dates of projects with Executive Committee meetings.

7. **Minutes of the Standing Committees Meetings**

The Minutes of the following Standing Committees were approved in the meeting of the Executive Committee held on 03.02.2022, with some observations recorded below:

- It was decided that anything approved in the minutes, contrary to Chamber policy or LCCI Articles or having financial implications, will be considered "not approved." Moreover, all functions of the standing committees will be organized on a self-financed basis.
- All Delegations would be as per LCCI SOPs through Delegation Department.

- 7.1 Mr. Haris Ateeq, Vice President, highlighted a suggestion forwarded by the Standing Committee on Membership in its meeting held on 22-01-2022 about announcing an amnesty scheme for ceased members. He said as the proposal sent by the Committee carries a significant change in fee structure, the House should have a debate before reaching any conclusion.
- 7.2 Mian Tariq Rehman, Mian Attiq-ur-Rehman, Mr. Abdul Wadood Alvi, Mr. Nadeem Qureshi, Mrs. Shamim Akhtar, Chaudhry Wajid Ali, Mr. Tahir Manzoor Chaudhry, Mr. Mardan Ali Zaidi, Mr. Kashif Bashir, Malik Riaz Iqbal, Mr. Muhammad Naem Hanif, Mr. Tariq Mehboob, and Mr. Rizwan Haider participated in the debate regarding amnesty scheme.

- 7.3 Mian Tariq Rehman said that the LCCI has been offering amnesty schemes several times in the past ten years. He disagreed with the proposed fee of Rs. 1000/- instead of outstanding dues against a member firm. Mian Nauman Kabir, President LCCI, and Mian Attiq-ur-Rehman also seconded the proposal of Mian Tariq Rehman. Mr. Tahir Manzoor Chaudhry proposed to charge two fees for renewals under the amnesty scheme till 31st March. Mr. Mardan Ali Zaidi and Mr. Abdul Wadood Alvi offered to charge one current year fee and one thousand rupees per year.
- 7.4 In contrast, Mr. Muhammad Nadeem Qureshi suggested dividing the outstanding fee into different slabs of two, five, and ten years. Mr. Kashif Bashir argued that members who pay regularly should be respected, and Members paying after several years without fines should not be encouraged. Mian Tariq Rehman believed that usually, people apply for membership only for visa recommendation letters and discontinue after one year. In case of need, they take new membership with some new business name.
- 7.5 Chaudhry Wajid Ali endorsed the viewpoint of Mian Tariq Rehman linking visa seekers and the amnesty scheme. He said people sometimes demand renewal of ceased membership to take advantage of the old membership number. Keeping in view the situation, the committee proposed to charge one current fee and one thousand rupees for every year passed, and by mistake, it was written in the minutes to charge one thousand as a final payment. Mr. Abdul Wadood Alvi supported the proposal and requested its approval from the house.
- 7.6 Mr. Rizwan Haider pointed out that LCCI charged Rs. 1300/- as a renewal fee from Associate Class members last year. Now, the fee is reduced to one thousand rupees under the amnesty scheme, showing very little or no relief for the members. He proposed a rational replacement and win-win situation for both LCCI and members. Malik Riaz Iqbal proposed to charge 50 percent of outstanding dues and a 50 percent discount under the amnesty scheme. Malik Muhammad Nadeem supported the idea of Mian Tariq Rehman and Mr. Muhammad Nadeem Qureshi. He expressed that, on the one side, LCCI has increased membership fees and, on the other hand, allowed discounts to old members.
- 7.7 Mr. Tariq Mehboob invited the chair's attention towards the current fee charged under the amnesty scheme, which is 60 percent discount and 40 percent payment of outstanding dues. He termed it unattractive for ceased members. Mian Maqbool Siddique proposed a 50 percent discount, and Muhammad Riaz-ul-Hassan requested to treat Corporate and Associate classes separately for a balanced favor to both Classes. Mr. Tahir Manzoor Chaudhry said after the amendment in the Memorandum and Articles of Association new fee structure shall apply to ceased members.
- 7.8 Mian Rehman Aziz, Senior Vice President, clarified that law does not allow to apply a new fee on previous years. The Chair, while concluding the debate on amnesty scheme, announced a 50 percent discount on ceased members' renewals until 31st March 2022.

- 7.9 Mr. Muhammad Naeem Hanif thanked the Chair and proposed to divide standing committees into groups under the supervision of EC members to ensure worthwhile and realistic contribution from these committees. He suggested allowing turn by turn opportunity to every member present in the House to speak. Mr. Muhammad Naeem Hanif highlighted weak mobile phones signals in busy market areas in Lahore. He said currently, businesses are using mobile data in every sphere of business activity. He also invited attention towards the misuse of fingerprints by a lobby of fraudulent people involved in selling mobile SIM cards based on stolen data from NADRA. He proposed inviting top bosses of NADRA and PTA to discuss these issues at Lahore Chamber of Commerce and Industry. The Chair agreed and directed to arrange meetings with Chairmen NADRA and PTA.
- 7.10 Mr. Tariq Mehboob proposed smart working with standing committees minutes to better understand and decision-making in EC meetings. He suggested preparing a summary based on the proposals of standing committees as the reading of all minutes is a complex and time-consuming job.
- 7.11 Mr. Nadeem Qureshi and Mrs. Tehmina Chaudhry proposed circulating the Executive Committee agenda electronically to save paper waste. They added that it would save a vast quantity of paper by adopting email as a mode of communication for agenda papers. The Chair agreed to the proposal. He announced circulating the summary on paper and the rest of the copies electronically to the EC members.

8. Any Other Item

- 8.1 Resignations of Mian Tariq Rehman, immediate past President and Mr. Muhammad Nasir Hameed Khan, immediate SVP, were accepted. Mr. Muhammad Jawad of M/s JSN Traders (Pvt.) Ltd (Corporate Class) and Mr. Ahmad Faraz Arshad of M/s Ahmed Bearing Center (Associate Class) were co-opted under Articles 22 (viii) of MAOA.
- 8.2 Mr. Mardan Ali Zaidi shared a presentation on 100 Years Celebrations and updated the house on the current stages of different projects organized under the banner of LCCI. The events under LCCI Spring Festival are:
