

Mian Tariq Hassan

Tariq is currently a Partner at the Lahore-based law firm: Hassan & Rahim – Advocates & Legal Consultants, which provides dispute resolution services (litigation, arbitration & mediation) as well as non-contentious corporate transactional, advisory and consultancy services.

Tariq’s mentor at the beginning of his law career was Barrister Aitzaz Ahsan with whom he worked as an Associate Advocate from 2004 to 2006.
